Wednesday saw the Delegates Orientation where Ron and Rob learned the rules of the Forums and Council of Representatives (CR) and met the candidates. Many interesting workshops were presented at the same time so Ron and Rob were unable to attend the workshops. New friends were made with delegates from other states.

Deaf Center is Rescued!

A meeting was held at UCCD on June 29 to explain the state budget crisis and how it could drastically affect the USOR and Deaf Center. The Utah Legislature was considering a consolidation of USOR with the Division of Workforce Services. This would have effectively changed the Deaf Center into a Job Service Center. Over 200 pink postcards and emails were sent to the legislators, especially members of the Public Education Appropriations Committee with a rallying cry "LEAVE THE USOR AND DEAF CENTER ALONE!" Other disabled groups, such as the blind and speech-impaired, were also involved in the lobbying efforts.

Many of us attended the committee meetings and during the two day special session, sat in the gallery. When it became clear that the USOR and services would be left alone, a loud cheer and applause was heard. The Chair frowned and said noise from the gallery is not allowed.

The lobbying was effective! In fact, some funds were restored to USOR and the Deaf Center. A victory celebration lunch was held at the Blind Center with several legislators in attendance who helped us. They gave short speeches and expressed their appreciation for the opportunity to work with us. Unfortunately, they are not running again so they encouraged us to make new friends in the Utah Legislature.

Please contact the Republican legislators and say "THANK YOU FOR LEAVING THE USOR AND DEAF CENTER ALONE!". We need their support now and in the next few years.

I attended the National Association of the Deaf's biennial conference in Washington, DC with Rob Kerr as UAD Delegates. Frankly, the experience was overwhelming. Other delegates assured me

that it is normal to feel "over-my-head" as a 1st time delegate. I lived the whole week in a state of awe at the other delegates and NAD officers. Libby Pollard, as the outgoing NAD president, is the best I've ever seen at chairing a delegates meeting. I told them that I talked to people in the TRIPOD booth at the NAD Conference. If you have a local theater that you want to show open captioned movies, just send their name and address to TRIPOD. They will contact the local theater and do all the work. Simple as that! I've already contacted deaf people in Ogden, Logan and St. George for names and addresses of local theaters. As of today, Ogden and St. George have given me names and addresses which I've forwarded to TRIPOD.

I received a complaint about the interview process at SLCC and met with Jes Julander. Jeff Pollock of the University of Utah also came to the meeting. I found out their interview process is unique and was done in an attempt to make it fair for hearing and deaf applicants. I'm not convinced this was done but it is certainly a creative attempt and has some pros and cons worth looking at. They've been doing it for 3 years and apparently this is the first complaint about it to my knowledge. Jeff and I made some suggestions about improving the process but it will be up to them to implement them.

Please come to the UAD General meeting on September 21. Rob Kerr and I will give our reports about the NAD Conference. April Trocki, MDUP State Director, will give her report about the meetings she attended as well as Rebecca Ann Davenport, MDU, about her experiences in the Miss Deaf America Pageant. There are several proposals to amend the bylaws so please jot this date on your calendar.

I'm excited about the start-up of the new Leadership Academy for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (LADHH) by Eli McCowan. This is an excellent leadership training program that will benefit UAD in years to come. Eleven people have already signed up. Believe me, we will reap the rewards!

Utah Selected as RID Testing Supersite

Linda Allington, Utah RID LTA/Site Coordinator. announced that Utah is now an RID Testing Supersite. What this means is that RID performance tests can be offered in Utah by appointment. This will give Utah

interpreters an unprecedented opportunity to become RID certified. The written tests will still be given in conjunction with the national testing schedule, first Saturdays of June and December, as required by RID. However, the performance tests and the ASL version of the CDI tests can now be handled much more flexibly.

Video Relay Service Now Available

As of May 1, 2002. Communication Service for the Deaf (CSD) and Sprint teamed up to offer nationwide Video Relay Service. If you are deaf or hard of hearing and prefer to communicate in ASL through high speed Internet access, then this may be the right solution for you.

Video Relay works like the traditional telephone relay service except that you use a computer, a video camera, and high speed Internet access to communicate in ASL with a Video ASL Interpreter instead of using a TTY.

Simply type in www.utvrs.com or www.usavrs.com on your web browser, and you can reach CSD's video relay home page. You can register and then be connected to a Video Interpreter (VI). The Video Interpreter will translate in ASL the hearing person's message and voice your ASL message.



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

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In order to access USA VRS, your computer must meet certain requirements – the most basic requirement is that your computer has 500 MHz. In addition, high speed internet access (DSL, T1 or cable) is needed in order to view the video clearly.

Video Relay Service is available Monday through Friday 7:00 am - 10:00 pm Mountain Standard Time (MST), Saturday 7:00 am - 6:00 pm MST, and Sunday 11:00 am - 10:00 pm MST.

You may reach USA VRS when it is busy, so please stay on the line, and your call will be taken as soon as a VI becomes available for your call.

Hearing callers can dial 1-866-410-5787 in order to contact you through Video Relay Service (when you have the appropriate computer, software, high speed Internet connection, and camera).

For more information on how to set up your computer to use USA VRS, visit the website at www.usavrs.com or e-mail the help desk at VRSHelpDesk@c-s-d.org. You may also contact Kelli Toohill with the Utah Public Service Commission at (801) 530-6638 (V/TTY), (801) 530-6796 (fax), or ktoohill@utah.gov for any assistance you may need or questions you need answered.

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No long distance fees! This is what Sprint, AT & T, and MCI are offering through their Internet Relay service. The service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It is available in all 50 states and for local, domestic or international calls. No special software or equipment is needed - launch your calls directly from your web browser on your desktop computer, laptop, cell phone, or PDA.

Sprint also offers three languages - English, Spanish and French Creole. Your conversation can be printed or saved at the end of your call.

AT & T internet relay service includes a full screen dialog window, adjustable font size and color, as well as print out capability.

MCI internet relay service also includes a full screen dialog window, adjustable font size and color, as well as print out capability.

For Sprint, log on to www.sprintrelayonline.com.

For AT & T, log on to www.relay.att.com.

For MCI, log on to www.ip-relay.com.

Try all three of them and see how they work for you!
