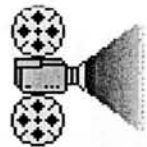

During the trial period, the Commission waived the statutory any financial guidelines required by statute. Ron Burdett Retires



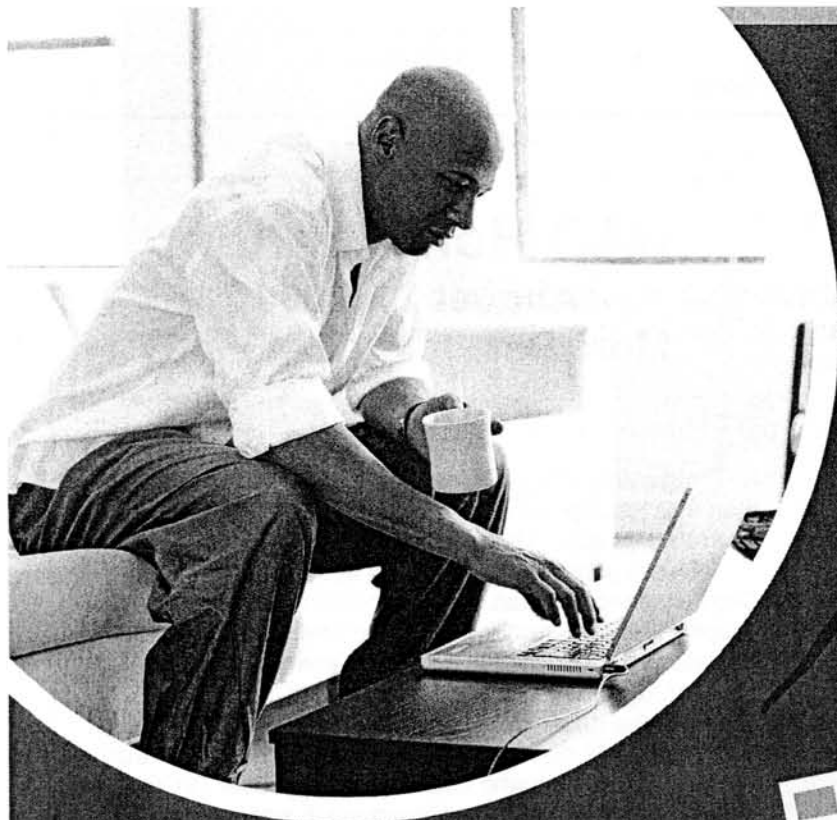

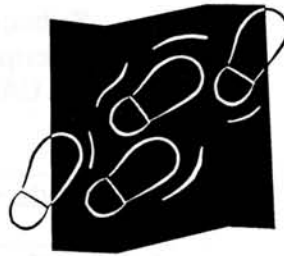
