#### Joene Nicolaisen Honored by State of Utah

Joene Nicolaisen received the Utah State Governor's Award for Excellence in Public Service on June 3 in a cere-

mony at the State Capitol. Joene was nominated by coworker, Jennifer Storrer, both of whom are employed by the



Division of Services for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DSDHH) in Taylorsville, Utah. Governor Jon H. Huntsman Jr. gave the opening remarks and signed a Proclamation making June 4 Utah Public Employees Appreciation Day. Jeff Herring, Executive Director, DHRM, introduced the winners. A Department of Rehabilitation (USOR) Program Director Bill Gibson presented Joene with the award, substituting for Marilyn Call (DSDHH Director) who was out of town at the time.

Joene Nicolaisen has worked for the State of Utah for several years. She has been a mental health counselor and case manager with DSDHH for six years. For the last eight years, Joene has donated much for her free time as a volunteer Executive Director for the Sego Lily Center for the Abused Deaf (SLCAD). SLCAD is a unique agency in Utah that supports Deaf, Deaf-Blind and Hard of Hearing victims and survivors of abuse. During the last year, Joene was able to secure a large federal grant from the Department of Justice, Violence Against Women. This grant will serve Deaf and Hard of Hearing victims and survivors of abuse in rural areas of Utah and has allowed SLCAD to hire paid staff for the first time.

#### **Sorenson Open House**

Sorenson hosted an open house on June 17 under sunny skies, where close to 200 attended. Announcement was

made of three new developments to benefit Sorenson customers. Pat Nola, president and CEO, made the announcement; his comments are below.

DirectVP allows hearing customers to call their deaf clients directly, without having to dial one number and give another one. This simplified the process between hearing and deaf people. "This new feature will greatly simplify and streamline the process for hearing callers to contact deaf individuals who use SVRS, further helping to break down communication barriers, which is Sorenson's mission."

- SIP Relay Mobile for Blackberry allows deaf people with that pager to call hearing people. "We are pleased to be able to offer this powerful and flexible mobile communication tool to deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals, "SIPRelay Mobile for BlackBerry smartphones makes it easier for users to connect to the SIPRelay service. It is our goal to continue to create innovative solutions that provide communication options for the deaf and hard-of-hearing community."
- 911 service those with VP can dial 911 for emergency service. "911 service is as important to a deaf person as it is to a hearing person, "Sorenson has offered prioritized 911 services to its VRS users for more than a year, which has resulted in our leading the industry in offering emergency VRS services. Sorenson invested in interpreter training, VRS education for 911 operators, and back-end integration with Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs). Sorenson Communications made the decision to invest in 911 technology years ago because it is a vital service that should be available for all callers."

Attendees were given a tour of the Sorenson VRS area, demonstrations of features, free shirts and treated to refreshments.
