Save the Deaf Center Rally a Success!

Nearly 500 people came to the Save the Deaf Center Rally on January 14 at the Sanderson Community Center for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. While there they signed postcards or letters for their senators and representatives at the Utah Capitol. Deaf and hard of hearing people, interpreters, CODAs and friends from all over – Logan all the way along the Wasatch Front to Lehi - came and enjoyed a buffet meal during the six-hour event.

Several organizations stepped forward to donate money for the cause: Purple Communications, Jean Massieu School PTA, Sorenson Communications and InterWest Interpreting / Hawk Communications threw their support of the rally. Their partnership was crucial to the success of the rally. In addition, individuals donated cash to help with the rally expenses.

With the economy taking a nosedive, the legislature is posed to make severe cutbacks, as much as 15% percent of the budget. The Sanderson Center made cutbacks totaling 12.5%, to its staff and programs last fall. The center's \$2.2 million budget depends solely on state funding under the Utah State Office of Rehabilitation, and does not receive any federal funding or grants. The deaf center currently has 22 employees (one will leave in May and the position will not be filled), and 5 employees are housed at the deaf center under other agencies. The center is home away from home for many people who make good use of the facility, whether it be playing volleyball, socializing, attending classes, using computers, TTYs, VPs,

one-on-one consultation for hard of hearing issues and for mental health services.

While news circulated in the gym that USOR would not require laying off more employees, programs and services are subject to scrutiny for cutbacks. The center laid off two full-time employees and about 10 part-timers late last year. Marilyn Call has been the director of Sanderson Center since 1992, and is assisted by three managers and approximately 20 employees.

Mandatory 10 Digit Dialing to Take Effect

Everyone now should be dialing all local calls using the full 10 digit (area code + 7 digit phone number). Effective March 1, 2009, this is mandatory. After this date, calls dialed with 7 digits will not go through.

A new area code, 385, will take effect as a new area code. The new 385 area code overlays the geographic area covering 801 area code. The introduction of the 385 area code will affect residents of Davis, Morgan, Salt Lake, Weber and Utah counties.

Mandatory 10 Digit Dialing to Take Effect

(Continued from Front Page)

What will remain the same?

- Your telephone number, including current area code, will not change
- The price of a call, coverage area, or other rates and services will not change due to the overlay
- What is now a local call will remain a local call regardless of the number of digits dialed
- You will still dial just three digits to reach 911. If 211, 311, 411, 511, 611, 711 and 811 are currently available in your community, you will still dial them with just three digits.

Johnston, of North Ogden, Utah, won all the events comfortably, except for the final one, the 800 meters, in which she was runner up. The Weber State trackster's time for the event was good enough to give her the world record of 4,903 points.

For the 2008-2009 academic year, the Ned C. Wheeler Scholarship Foundation for the Deaf has awarded a scholarship of \$1,000 each to Christina Hamilton and Elayne Fife.

The scholarship foundation, which had its beginnings in 1946 and which underwent several name changes, is named for Ned C. Wheeler, founder of the organization.




