This success was due to the preparation completed before hand by Chair, Kristi Mortensen, and the OUTSTANDING team of over 50 volunteers and Deaf Center Staff! Many of you put in long and hard hours to contribute to the success of the WRAB! In the end, the final match was between TAPS (Tucson Arizona Public Schools) and CSDF (California School for the Deaf – Fremont). The end result was CSDF winning the 1<sup>st</sup> place over TAPS of a score 73-47. One of his sons, Gary, surprised his dad by coming from Pasadena, California to spend a few days with him. His other son, Barry, lives in Layton with his wife Teresa. Barry and Teresa have two children, Mikki and Robbie.

#### **Deaf Advocates Were There!**

Why did we go to the state capitol?

We, the state employees, showed our disagreement against the legislative attempts to change our retirement system that would influence our future.

#### What was going on?

With huge cutbacks in 180,000 employees' pension benefits for future workers and eliminating a 1.5 percent 401(k) match would throw the monkey wrench in our financial future.

Senator Dan Liljenquist from Bountiful proposed four bills that would change the whole picture of the retirement. As of today, one of the bills was thrown out.

- These bills will affect state workers, firemen and police forces
- These bills will reduce the benefit package for new workers therefore it will be harder to find good employees to do hard jobs.
- Also the retirement date for employees would be increased by 5 years. For example the usual number of working for the state is 30 years before the retirement could be drawn in full. Now it will be increased to 35 years.

What has the Great recession done to the state employees?

- Their stock market is hit
- The state pension fund's value is down by about 20-30% It took 80 years to build this pension before it became another victim to the Great Recession
- Nearly 800 state employees were laid off.

One speaker expressed, "If we are cut, the state government will really be messed up. Some of us current employees may want to leave state government. We have accepted low pay because of the god benefits...and future new potential workers will look for better paying job in the private sector.

2,500 supporters were expected, but 4,000 were there on that glorious day!



#### Alumni Gather for Gallaudet Club

With Gallaudet University sponsoring the Western Regional Academic Bowl, alumni gathered to socialize at the Gallaudet Club, held at Crystal Inn, and to hear from various Gallaudet people.

Sam Sonnenstrahl, executive director of Gallaudet University Alumni Association and director of Gallaudet University Alumni Relations, spoke of working together to make Gallaudet events successful, such as the Academic Bowl. On behalf of GUAA, he wished Dr. Robert Sanderson a happy 90th birthday. Sandie graduated from Gallaudet College (as it was known then) in 1941.

Lorin Melander, president of Beehive Chapter of GUAA, thanked local alumni for volunteering at the Western Regional Academic Bowl, and said he was excited about having Gallaudet people visit Utah.

Alyce Slater Reynolds, president of GUAA, mentioned how much more involved alumni have been with Gallaudet affairs in recent years and encouraged alumni to support the university by giving.

With Dr. Alan Hurwitz, president of Gallaudet University, unable to attend, Dr. Jay Innes, dean of CPSO (College of Professional Studies and Outreach) represented Dr. Hurwitz. Dr. Innes spoke about the strategic plan and changes at the university.

Patsy Bowman, Development Officer at Gallaudet University, explained the Buff and Blue Fever (class competition in terms of donations). She encouraged alumni to contribute on a continuing basis so that alumni could be counted.

David Reekers, from the GU Admissions Office, gave information about the new admissions requirements and how Gallaudet is retaining students to graduation. He also indicated that the quality of students has improved, leading to better retention rates.

There were door prizes. An auction was held for a Gallaudet afghan; the highest bid was \$250. The proceeds will go to student scholarships.

The program concluded with Sandie cutting his birthday cake and sharing it with everyone.


